From the pen of Pastor Mark

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus.

As we transition now into Advent, thanks again so much for your generosity with all the pledge intents returned so far for 2024 and for the strong, faithful giving in offerings and *Our Christmas Gifts to the Lord* over and above gifts. We are in a *much* better place financially already with our recent giving, and we still have several weeks to go! Here are the weeks remaining for our over and above gifts:

Week 4 (Dec. 10) honors Social Ministry like MUST, Habitat, Redeemer Food Ministries, etc.

Week 5 (Dec. 17) honors our Pastoral and Church Staff Ministry

Week 6 (Dec. 24) honors the one above all we honor every week... our Lord Jesus, Emmanuel!

We often think of Advent as the season leading up to Christmas, and for obvious reasons, since on the calendar Advent directly precedes Christmas. If you have thought of Advent as pointing to Christmas, you're right! But there's more. Advent is not only about the coming of the Christ child. It's also looking forward to the second coming of Christ, in the coming day of the Lord.

One Advent scripture that speaks to Christ coming again is Matthew, in which Jesus says "you will hear of wars, and rumors of wars; see that you are not alarmed; for this must take place, but the end is not yet" (Matthew 24:6). Doesn't that sound like our times, with wars ongoing, and rumors of wars to come? Rumors can get us anxious and worried. Maybe that's one reason Matthew says "see that you are not alarmed." It's always great to check the source. Otherwise how do you know or seek the truth?

Let's look at this again in terms of the end times. After descriptions of earthquakes and various cosmic events as signs and omens, Jesus then gives a sobering truth to anyone seeking certainty in earthly or celestial signs, saying "But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father" (Matthew 24:36). No wonder all the predictors of the end times to date have been wrong! In case we haven't fully gotten it yet, Jesus says "Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming" (Matthew 24:42).

So let's keep awake together, looking beyond rumors and portents, looking to the source of the truth together this Advent. And the truth in all of this is coming in a manger soon and very soon, and is seated in heaven at the right hand of the Father and will come again in glory. May the truth transform our fears into faith, our worries into witness, and our anxiousness into adoration of the newborn king.


Our Christmas Gifts to the Lord

What Is Scrip?

It is a fundraising program where the companies allow us to sell their gift cards and give us a percentage of the card value. You can use scrip to purchase everyday expenses like food, clothing, and other essentials and gift cards, and with every purchase, you earn revenue for Holy Trinity's programs and ministries.

How scrip generates revenue for Holy Trinity Social Ministry & Modern Worship Service

The Raise Right acts on behalf of churches, schools and other non-profit organizations to purchase large amounts of scrip from grocery stores, department stores, and other retailers. Because the scrip is purchased with cash up front, the participating retailers offer a substantial discount. Holy Trinity buys the scrip from Raise Right at a discount, and re-sells the certificates to families like yours for full face value.

The discount - from two to fifteen percent or more - is Holy Trinity's revenue.

The last date to order the cards is 12/9 with delivery on 12/16.

We accept cash, checks or credit card payments.

From your 2023 and 2024 Congregational Council:

Greetings and peace from your Council as we enter the season of Advent together. This is the first of what we plan as periodic touchpoints of communication with the congregation as we move forward in ministry together. We are committed to sharing our plans openly and intentionally to ensure a healthy church and ministry together. Mutual communication is key, and we will have multiple avenues to obtain input and feedback. As part of this, we as a Council strive to faithfully address any concerns. One recent question is that of availability of dates and times for memorial services. The leadership team has been in conversation over this; Pastor Mark, the staff, and Council all agree in order to best support the congregation, memorials, weddings, and other life events need to be given the opportunity to be held on weekday afternoons as well as weekends, while scheduled services and preplanned events remain unchanged.

To help with open and intentional communication with the congregation and staff, both our Council President Al Nordin and Pastor Mark have been in conversation with the bishop.

Another recent question brought to Council was that of staff turnover at Holy Trinity. It's true that we have had a number of staff departures. This has come from a variety of reasons that range from life changes such as moving, health, needing more hours, needing more money, other employment opportunities, and even retirements. The Personnel Committee and Pastor Mark have worked with all of them through the process and to make the transition as easy as possible. There have been several occasions where the staff member made the decision but did not want it immediately announced. On those occasions, the Personnel Committee started the process of gathering applicants prior to the announcement to the congregation so that the positions would not be vacant long.

In other news, **Shyla Files** is settling well into the role of Church Administrator and is excited to be part of a caring staff team and congregation. **Thomas Eisnor** has just begun as our new Director of Music Ministry and has already worked to ensure the music ministry programs are running smoothly. He has asked that we not fill the part-time Associate Director of Music Ministry position until he determines the gaps he needs to fill. It was wonderful seeing **Dr. Won-Hee An** return to help with the recent "Friendsgiving Paws Concert" and for helping lead music and worship for a recent memorial service just prior to Thomas Eisnor's first day. **Teresa Hodges** is doing better, and we are pleased to welcome her back on a part-time contract basis to help us update the website. It was also an unexpected treat having her join us in worship on Sunday. We are actively in the process of filling the Facilities Manager position. For all our hiring, we bring in additional hiring panel members from the congregation interested in and associated with that specific ministry. It is a team effort. Thanks again to our Personnel Committee for your faithful work with our staff behind the scenes. Our current Personnel Committee members are Donna Formato, Jim Wood, Matt Miller, Stella Blenner and Victoria Crean.

We affirm Pastor Mark and staff and appreciate the love, effort, leadership and dedication that they show to Holy Trinity. We also want to acknowledge our appreciation to all volunteers who help with our ministry.

We wish our congregational family a safe and happy Advent and Christmas season.
