*From the pen
of Pastor Mark*

Dear Family of God,

In February for our Lenten journey, we used our mid-week services to retrace the wandering in the wilderness of the people of Israel. We began with Moses and the burning bush in Exodus chapter 3. As we transition now toward the summer season, with upcoming ends to the school year and graduations, plans for summer travel, and a shift back to one Sunday service at the end of May, let's take a moment together to revisit the burning bush. It happened when Moses was out and about, shepherding sheep. With spring and summer plans that for many of us will include being out and about, let's keep our eyes open for burning bushes, for signs of God's presence out in the world and of God's call to us in surprising and unexpected ways.

So how do we prepare ourselves for a "burning bush?" What do you do when something unusual happens, right there in your midst, and your deep sense is that it's the very presence of God calling to you in some way? We don't exactly have road maps for how to navigate and respond to God's call to us out in the world. Plus, there could be millions of ways God might choose to reach out, that have nothing to do with bushes at all. So what do we look for?

Let's take Moses as a possible guide for us. First, I don't think we have to try to look for anything, given that God could choose innumerable, creative ways to reach out. Looking for particular "things" (like bushes for instance) may actually distract us rather than guide us. With the burning bush, God made it apparent and obvious for Moses. The key, I believe, is to be open and receptive to God's call. With the burning bush, Moses stopped what he was doing and stepped aside. This seemingly simple act is actually a huge step for those of us who tend to be super busy and caught up in whatever is going on. Moses could have seen the bush, decided it just didn't make sense, and continued on his journey returning to a mindfulness of the sheep and soon forgetting all about any strange bush. This kind of response may be the most common way that people miss out on signs of God's active presence in the world. So, before anything else, when you see what could potentially be a sign from God, take the time to stop and step aside from whatever path you had been taking to that point.

Second, God speaks to Moses and tells him to take off his sandals, because the place he is standing on is holy ground (see vs. 5). How often do we take off our shoes, our human-made coverings for our feet that provide us a cushion but also a barrier from the ground? When we remove our shoes, we connect our feet with the earth. It's a relational act of connection to God's creation and also an act of vulnerability. There are spurs and rocks and thorns out there, after all. Because of this, we are way less likely to stomp our way around and much more likely to walk humbly, taking note of each step. Both literally and symbolically, this is a great way to respond when we sense that God is calling.

Finally, when God displays a "burning bush" to us, expect change. It signaled a time for Moses to return to Egypt, and begin a journey with God that would free the people of Israel from Pharaoh. Who but God knows where our path ahead may lead. But one thing's for sure. God doesn't introduce burning bushes in order for us to continue the same old same old.

So let's get out and about this spring and summer, with openness to stop and step aside when God calls, taking off our "shoes" to walk the holy ground before us, going forward in faith and joy wherever God leads us next.



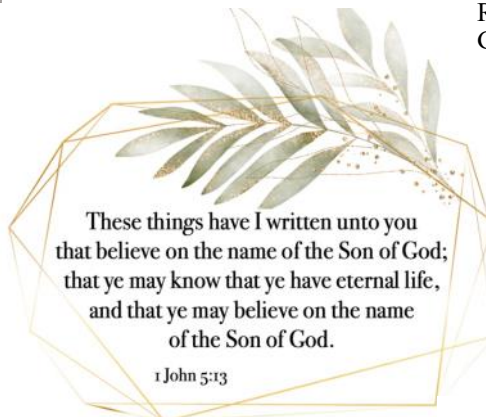

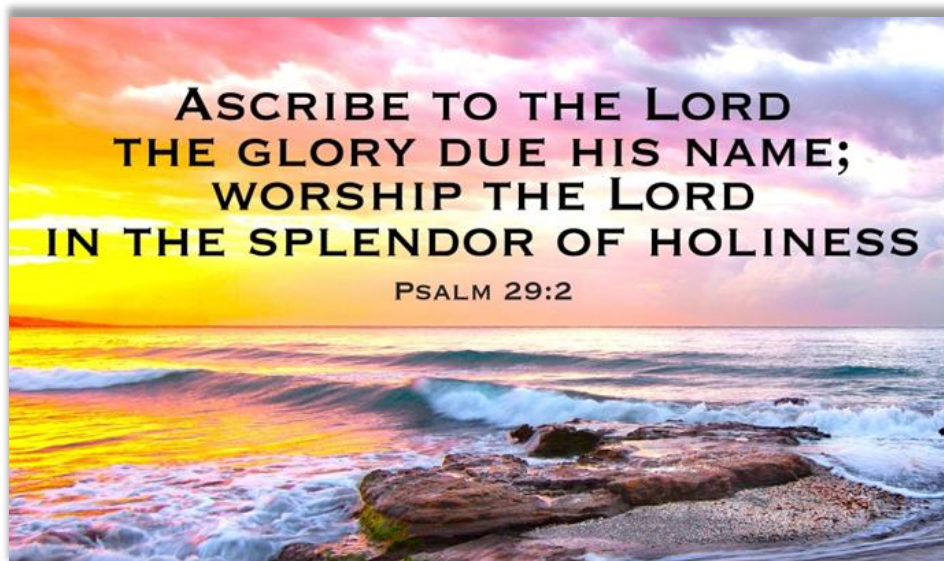
